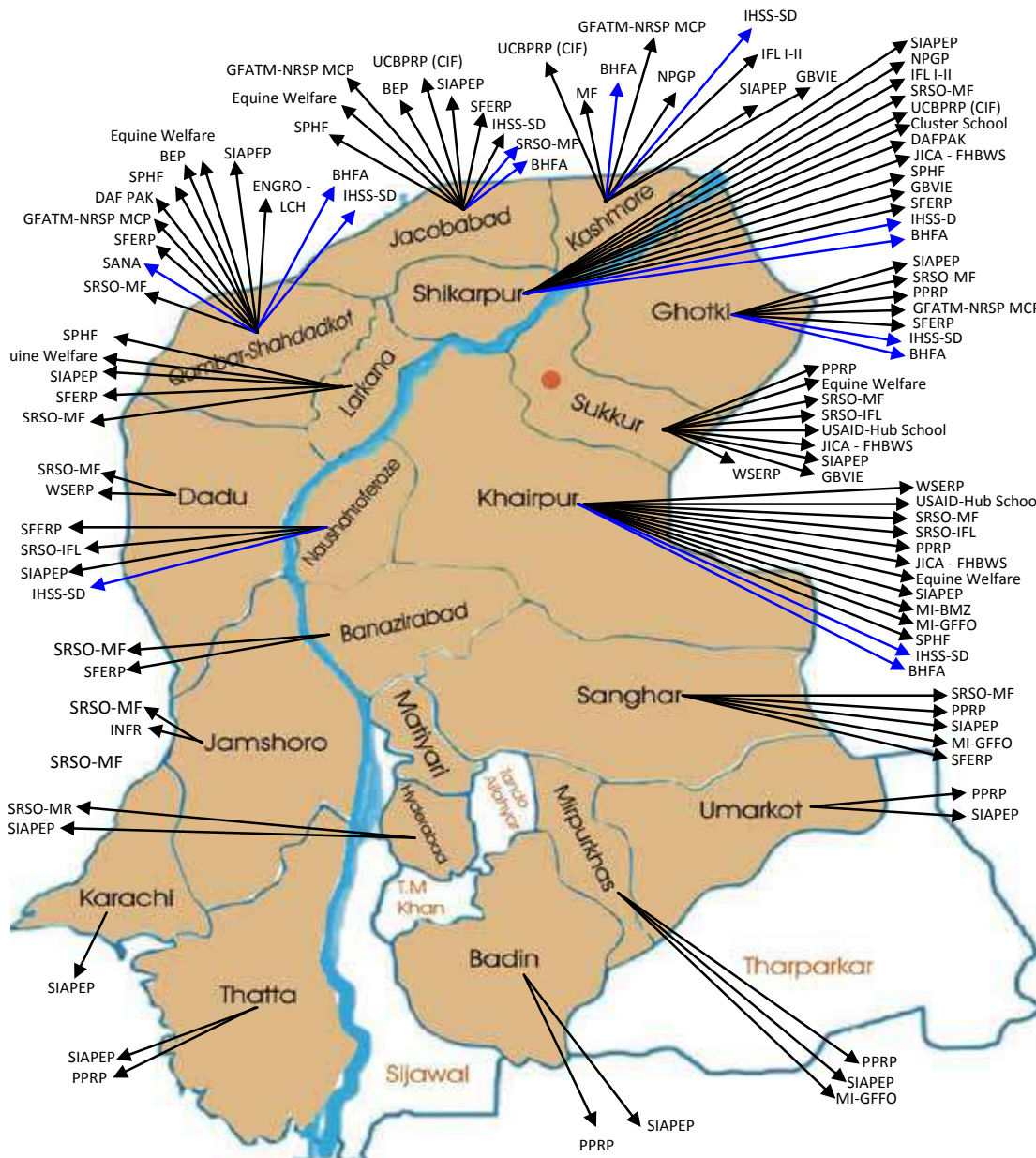

A total of 1, 667 students, teachers and support staff of 12 schools were tested during the screening.

This kind of health screening is crucial for early detection and prevention of diseases, in order to take proactive measures to improve the overall health of the school community. He said, "It's important to ensure the early detection and prevention of diseases among students, teachers, and support staff for their better health."

Life had been tough for the family, and despite his family's financial difficulties, Zohaib was determined to pursue his education.

One day, a team from the Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) visited his village and held a session with the women who had BISP Pakistan cards. His mother was one of these women and was selected to receive an asset from the NPGP-IFAD program. Zohaib's family decided to use the intangible asset to help him polish skills, and he was sent to the Sukkur IBA University to learn digital skills.

During his time at the university, Zohaib was a diligent student and worked hard to excel in his studies. He was supported by NPGP-IFAD and SRSO, who encouraged him to reach his goals. As a reward for his hard work, he was given a laptop to use when he finished his three-month course. He started to work on line design different posters and IEC material and learn money as well.

Not long after, Zohaib saw a post on a social media platform advertising a job at Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO). He applied and was lucky enough to be selected. Zohaib is extremely thankful to Ministry of Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety, National Poverty Graduation Programme, International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) for the opportunity and was glad that his hard work had paid off. He is now able to support his family and fulfill his dreams of having a respectable career.

Thus after receiving 3rd installment and completing the roof level as well."

"I have started living in a new and safe house without any fear of damage in a rain or other emergency. I am very happy and now, focusing on my family's well-being, especially education. Of the children"
