

THE SITUATION REPORT

Monsoon Rain,2020- Calamity Affected Areas (Mirpurkhas, Badin, Thatta, Umerkot and Sanghar)



THE SITUATION

During the current monsoon, Sindh faced seven spells of moderate to heavy rains. These heavy rains affected several districts of Sindh out of which 20 Districts- are announced as “Calamity affected areas”. In pertinent to this, the updated assessment data shows that major damage has been caused by heavy rains and the precautionary steps have been taken by the relevant departments to mitigate further destruction in these areas.

The monsoon rains and subsequent flooding in different parts of Sindh have wreaked havoc with a total number of 3 deaths and **1,463** injuries across five districts of the Peoples’ Poverty Reduction Program funded by the Government of Sindh. Monsoon rainfalls which began from 25th of August damaged **166,215** households, **27,933** houses have been demolished, 3 Human losses, 100% crop destroyed in mentioned UCs, livestock: **1,013** out of which **927** Goats,5 Donkeys, and **12** Buffalo death with **39,665** Households migration in these districts.

IMMEDIATE RELIEF & REHABILITATION

The Rapid assessment is prepared by SRSO MER with help of Social Mobilization Team, LSO leaders and VO Leaders. These are so far reported figures. We will update on regular basis. The families affected are mostly migrated to either higher places or towards relatives: i.e. From Thatta to Kohistan, from Mirprukhas and Umerkot Tharparker along with their animals.

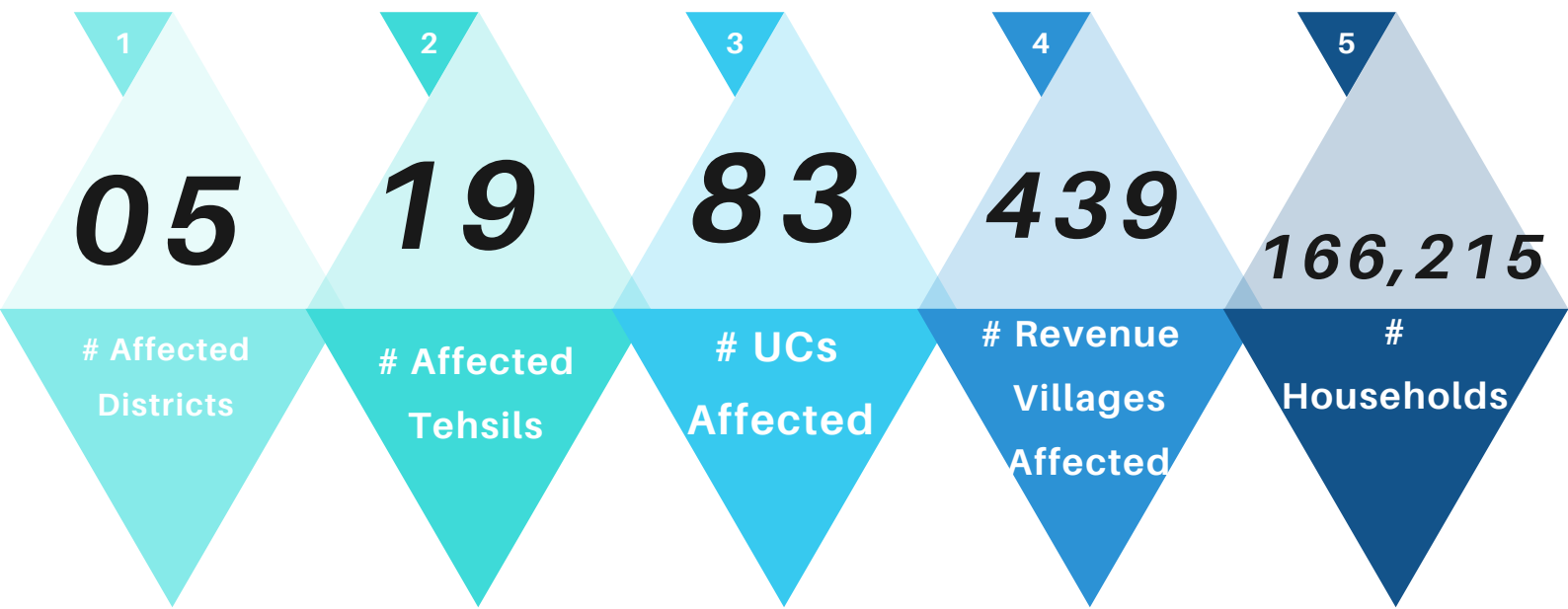

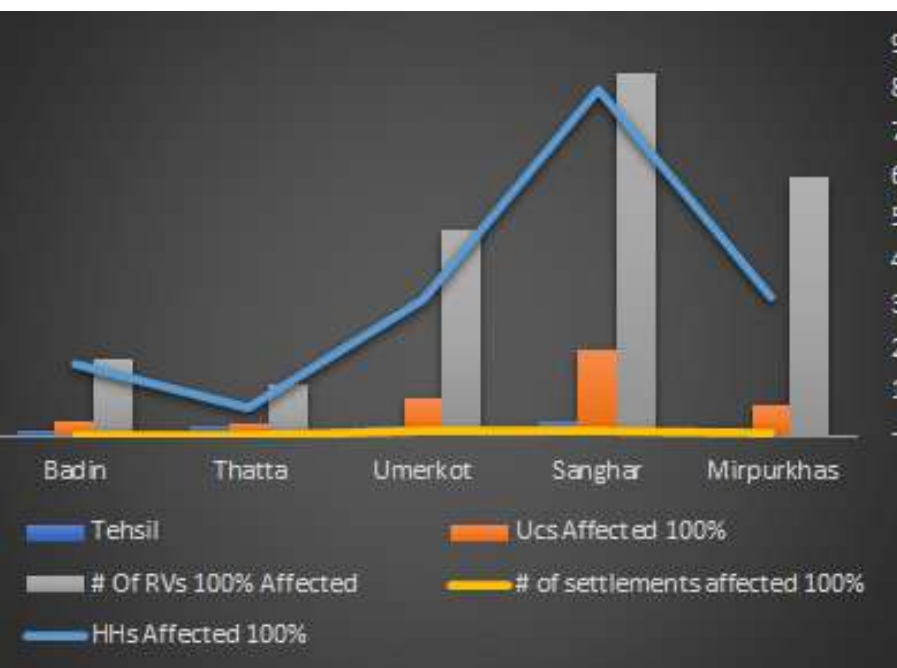

Relief Operation

Sindh Rural Support Organization

In connection to the relief work, the SRSO Sanghar and Umerkot Team under the chair of CEO SRSO started relief work in terms of: Ration bags, stitched clothes. In District Sanghar CEO SRSO distributed 200 ration bags among rain affected.

The stitched clothes were distributed in five Union Councils : UC Loon Khan, UC Kalar, UC Bhopi, UC Hathunga and UC Khahi.

In Umerkot, DM distributed 300 Stitched clothes to poorest rain affected households.



DAY HIGHLIGHTS



Detailed meeting was held with Mr Nadeem ul Rahman Memon, Deputy Commissioner Umerkot at SRSO office Umerkot regarding the rain affected emergency situation, relief operations and PPRP.

Coordination Meetings

In all District of Calamity affected areas, DMs conducted meeting with Deputy Commissioners', Assistant Commissioner regarding rescue and relief operation and support in assessment of losses of rain.

Warning of Overflow of Rivers/LBOD

Community stated that there is chemical river from Mirpurkhas fall into Puraan river was source to through water into sea and it was natural source to drainage water toward sea. Puraan river has been blocked and LBOD constructed which really become caused of flooded due to be overflow of water.

LBOD water toleration sq is 4600 and in documentation it could tolerate 9000 sq water, but recent flow in LBOD is more than 15000 to 18000. It is about to be overflow.

Risk

LBOD has been approached at peak point and could be unable to tolerate more flow of water. It will be caused to submerge other villages into water and severely more damage to previous submerged villages.
